




# ST. ANDREW'S CELEBRATING OUR PAST SHAPING OUR FUTURE



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I want to lift up to you all a wonderful event that is happening this month on June 10th and 11th. Our Artist's-in-Residence, the Core Ensemble will be presenting a world premiere production on those two days of "Equally Divine: The Real Story of the Mona Lisa". I also want to bring to your attention the Education for Ministry Program that is looking to recruit new members. This program, developed by the School of Theology faculty at the University of the South is a top notch program designed to help folk develop their ministry in new and creative ways. ### EDUCATION FOR MINISTRY

.You are invited to explore an adventure in spiritual growth with us. We are Education for Ministry and our four-year program encourages students to study and reflect on all areas of Christian study one year at a time. The 40 year-old worldwide program created by The University of the South School of Theology awards a certificate after completion. In the first year students review the Old Testament; the second year, the New Testament; the third year, Church History; and the fourth year issues from philosophy to the environment. This is not a Bible Study or a therapy session but a way for students to learn how to think theologically and intuitively. This powerful program encourages personal ministry and has a dynamic effect on a person's life. Sharing personal autobiographies helps each student reflect on their unique gifts and discern how best to serve God. The 36 week program costs \$350 per year and scholarships are available. EFM meets once a week from 1-3:30pm at St. Andrew's and we invite you to explore joining us in this powerful life-affirming journey. 
