### SAINT LUKE THE PHYSICIAN

Luke was a Gentile, a physician, and one of St. Paul's fellow missionaries in the early spread of Christianity through the Roman world. He has been identified as the writer of both the Gospel which bears his name, and its sequel, the Acts of the Apostles. He had apparently not known Jesus, but was clearly inspired by hearing about him from those who had known him. Luke was with Paul until the Paul's martyrdom in Rome. Tradition has it that Luke wrote his Gospel in Greece and died peacefully at age, eighty-four.





Just a quick note to remind you all to reserve this time and date on your calendars: 4:00pm, October 21, 2018, for the first *Zimmermann's Café Chamber Music* event of the new 2018-2019 season, at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in Lake Worth, FL.

The program will include works by five more outstanding South Florida composers. On the program are three movements from Dwight Banks' *Composite Sketches* for various combinations within the instrumentation of clarinet, trumpet, vibraphone, piano, and cello; Orlando Jacinto Garcia's *Escher Waterfall* for clarinet, trumpet, and piano; Charles Norman Mason's *Stagger* for clarinet, violin, and piano; one movement from Gregory Stepanich's *Concerto for Flugelhorn* arranged for flugelhorn and piano; and Ellen Zwilich's *Lament* for cello and piano.

Stay tuned for the listing of performers for the event; they are among South Florida's finest professional musicians.
